## **7. 21<sup>st</sup> Century Schools of Distinction Award 2018**

The "21<sup>st</sup> Century Schools of Distinction" Award recognises and showcases the efforts of schools nationwide to develop innovative approaches to teaching and learning. The scheme recognises the often-extraordinary work being successfully undertaken by such schools in challenging conditions and with limited resources. Winning schools demonstrate excellence in several core areas, including innovative approaches to 21st century teaching and learning, mentoring, leadership development and post-secondary readiness. ## **8. Transitions 18 - International Conference Innovative Learning Environments.**

Dr Aine Moran has been invited to speak at this conference in Copenhagen on our model of creating an Innovative Learning Environment in the Irish context. The conference is a trans-disciplinary, research symposium focusing on innovative learning environments in schools and higher education.

## **9. STEAM Academy - Excellence in STEM fund**

As part of our STEAM academy we have begun our Blue-Sky modules with 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and Transition students on Monday morning. Our Blue-Sky module is influenced by Brightworks pedagogy that involves three arcs: exploration, expression and exhibition. Blue Sky offers twenty different workshop style classes in topics as varied as bicycle maintenance, skincare, maths craft and economics. Students self-select which courses they want to be part of and develop their own project during the one hour Monday morning class. Students now take ownership of their learning, developing skills such as being self-directed in their learning, decision-making, and managing priorities in and out of school. Blue Sky groups are made up of students of different ages and experience. The Blue Sky module contributes to wellbeing by giving students choice, and fostering co-operation between students in different year groups thereby building up strong relationships. Blue Sky also encourages a type of learning that is broader than the exam focused curriculum.

The Board wishes to thank and congratulate all staff involved in the Blue Sky module.

## **10. Erasmus Partnership**

The Board is delighted to hear of the new Erasmus partnership with schools in Hungary and Spain. The main objective of the project is that our participating students will discover their religious identity in an intercultural environment as well as exchange and develop new practices regarding how values connected to their identity can be used when facing modern challenges in the future jobs market. Aine Moran, Laura Cahill and Kathryn Scannell will travel to Budapest for a planning meeting at the end of October.

## **11. Irish Times Article**

The Board wishes to thank Leah Collins for arranging with the Irish Times Magazine to publish a feature about the school which ran on the 25th August 2018. It received very positive feedback on its positive contribution to the debate on faith-based education.
